Thoughts From Pastor Jim

Just one more month until Advent starts on the first Sunday of December. I know that many of you have already started your Christmas shopping and preparations. Others of you do not begin to think about it until after Thanksgiving. I am challenging everyone to make this Christmas different.

Every year you will see, read or hear opinions that Christmas has become too commercial. People say that Christmas has

become all about the presents we give. To be honest, people were saying the same things when I was a boy, but no one seems to do anything about it. This bothered Rev. Michael Slaughter, pastor of Ginghamsburg United Methodist Church in Tipp City, Ohio. Rev. Slaughter decided to lead his congregation into this change. In 2004 he told his congregation that he wanted them to have a slim Christmas that year. He went on to challenge them with "whatever amount you spend on your friends and family, I challenge you to spend that same amount on people in need." This was a challenge to reject the selfcentered, consumer holiday that Christmas has become and move into a time where Christians can make a difference in the world. Christians can make many people's lives much better without spending any more money than they would normally. On October 22, I preached a message titled "Christmas is Not Your Birthday". On that Sunday we saw a video that showed that if the United States would take the money they spend just on presents at Christmas, they could eliminate hunger in the world. That would be a powerful witness to the world that Christians do care about others.

I challenge each person in the ministry to look at what they plan on spending at Christmas and consider spending ½ that amount on their friends and family so that they can spend the other ½ on those in need. This ministry will help support this through:

- 1. The **Heifer International** which supplies animals which can help support those in grinding poverty.
- 2. Support of RACAP (Randolph Area Christian Assistance Program) which is focused on the needs of people in this area.
- 3. **The Lydia Patterson Institute**, a ministry located in El Paso that provides Christian education for those on both sides of the border. This ministry enables youth who have little opportunity and to get the education they need to change their family's lives. Over 95% of graduates attend college or universities.
- 4. Children's Hunger Fund, an organization dedicated to eliminating hungry children in the world. Cont page 2
